Lewis County High School – 2019-2020 School Profile

Lewis County High School serves the educational needs of all high school student in Lewis County, West Virginia. The high school is grades 9-12 and has 678 students with 153 students in the senior class.

Lewis County High School is accredited by the **West Virginia Department of Education** and holds membership in the **College Board** and the **National Association for College Admission Counseling (491380)**.

The **academic program** is organized on a 8 - period day schedule, with two days of block classes. 4 credits per semester is the maximum course load; students take 8 classes Monday, Tuesday and Friday; on Wednesday (odd classes) and Thursday (even classes) students take 4 classes.

These **AP® courses** are offered: 2D Art, 3D Art, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Government and Politics: United States, Music Theory. **AP is an open-enrollment program.**

The following **Dual-Credit Courses** are also offered: Algebra, Anatomy w/Lab, Biology I w/Lab, Biology II w/Lab, English I, English II, Forensics I w/Lab, Forensics II w/Lab, Intro to Health Careers, Medical Terminology, Psychology, Sociology, Spanish I, Spanish II, and Trigonometry. By taking these courses student can earn high school and college credit at the same time. There is a charge for these classes.

Honors classes are offered in Biology, English 10, Math II, Math III STEM, Physics, Chemistry II, Spanish II, and History of Intolerance.

One **Advanced Career** program of study is offered and given honor status: AC Energy & Power I, II, III, IV.

Grade Point Average (GPA) Calculation

GPA is computed using the quality points below. Beginning with grade nine, all subjects, whether passed or failed, are included in the computation. A minimum of 24 credits are **required for graduation**. **AP, Dual Credit, and Honors classes are weighted by one point**. Grades are recorded on the transcript and GPA is computed in January and May.
