



## SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH CENTER

Services through the Community Care School-Based Health Center (SBHC) are available to all students, faculty and staff. Medicare, Medicaid and most insurances are accepted. Community Care participates with PEIA in the CCP program. If you carry PEIA, you may use our provider as your primary care provider and receive the associated benefits of the CCP program.

Services available include:

- Vaccinations
- Acute illnesses such as cold, flu, ear infections, etc.
- Well-Child and Well-Adult exams
- Accidents and injuries
- Nutrition counseling
- School and sports physicals
- Vision and Hearing screenings
- Standard lab services provided for SBHC patients
- Chronic illnesses such as asthma, allergies, diabetes, obesity, sickle cell anemia, seizures, etc.
- Attention Deficit Disorder (diagnosis and treatment)
- 24-hour on-call physician coverage
- and more...

Our school-based sites operate exactly like any other primary care physician's office. By utilizing our school-based health center, students avoid missing school if the issue is minor. For faculty and staff, utilizing our school-based health center prevents the use of a whole personal day off, when a visit can easily be handled during a planning period.
